Policy & Advocacy: Moving Ideas into Impact

“REDEVELOPING NEW JERSEY: PLANNING FOR PROSPERITY” — OUR NEW POLICY ROADMAP

This past June, New Jersey Future launched Redeveloping New Jersey: Planning for Prosperity, a comprehensive policy roadmap designed to guide redevelopment, housing production, infrastructure investment, and equitable community revitalization for the decade ahead. This roadmap is already serving as a strategic touchstone for decision-makers across the state. It marks a significant milestone in our commitment to advancing smart growth principles that strengthen neighborhoods, protect natural lands, and expand access to opportunity.



LANDMARK VICTORIES: LEAD DISCLOSURE AND TARGET ZERO BECOME LAW

This year brought two major wins for public health and transportation safety—victories that New Jersey Future directly helped secure.



The **Lead Disclosure Bill**, now signed into law, ensures that families receive clear, upfront information about potential lead hazards when renting a home. Our research, advocacy, and coalition engagement played a pivotal role in shaping and advancing this bill.



The **Target Zero Commission Bill**, now law, marks a major milestone in New Jersey's commitment to reducing roadway fatalities and serious injuries. New Jersey Future played a key role in advancing this legislation, drawing on our long-standing expertise in safe, accessible transportation to provide testimony, data, and policy guidance throughout the process.

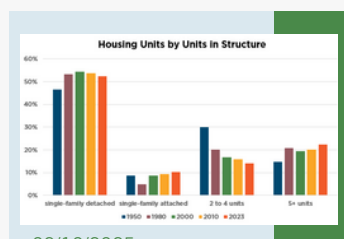

GREAT HOMES AND NEIGHBORHOODS FOR ALL: A NEW LENS ON HOUSING AFFORDABILITY

Last fall, we launched **Great Homes and Neighborhoods for All (GHNA)**—a statewide pro-housing initiative dedicated to helping New Jersey communities create a wider range of housing choices in well-planned neighborhoods. We bring together research, community stories, technical expertise, and local partners to explore practical approaches that strengthen neighborhoods—from redeveloping empty buildings to adding small, thoughtful homes that fit local character. Our work focuses on keeping communities stable, connected, and welcoming for people of all ages and backgrounds. A statewide poll underscored the urgent need for progress, revealing that nearly 90% of New Jersey voters agree legislators should take action on housing.

GHNA is helping policymakers and communities grapple with the realities residents face while identifying solutions that strengthen both people and place. This year, we released significant reports that advance this work. 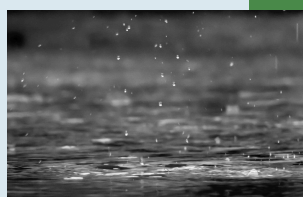

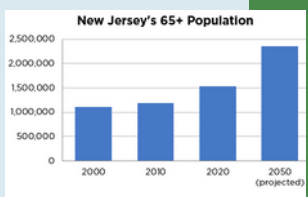

AGING POPULATION: PLANNING FOR A CHANGING NEW JERSEY

This year, New Jersey Future advanced the statewide conversation on inclusive, age-friendly communities with the release of a major report examining the implications of New Jersey's rapidly aging population. The analysis highlights the urgent need for planning, design, and infrastructure that allow residents of all ages to live safely, independently, and with dignity.

Building on this work, we also published ***Weathering the Storms: Creating Aging-Friendly Communities Amid Climate Change***, which explores how climate-related risks uniquely affect older adults and identifies strategies communities can use to prepare, adapt, and support aging residents. SAFE WATER FOR STUDENTS AND SCHOOLS

NJF and our partners at **Lead-Free NJ** played a key role in analyzing and communicating the need for state funding through the Securing Our Children's Future Bond Act program, addressing lead in schools. Run by the New Jersey Department of Education, this program has \$94 million available to help school districts remove lead in drinking water. Our work ensured policymakers, communities, and media outlets had clear, accessible information about the importance—and urgency—of keeping students, staff, and families safe.

RECONNECTING TRENTON'S RIVERFRONT & CAPITAL PARK FUNDING

From our **Reconnecting Trenton's Riverfront** project to ongoing advocacy for the construction of Capital Park, New Jersey Future remained steadfast in elevating innovative redevelopment and placemaking efforts in the state's capital city. These efforts continue to model what thoughtful, community-centered planning can achieve.

Our long-term effort with Reconnecting Trenton's Riverfront continues to elevate resident voices and support community-centered planning in the capital city. Our engagement and research efforts are laying the groundwork for transformative redevelopment and public space improvements.

With our partners, we secured full funding for the development of **Capital Park**, immediately adjacent to the State House. We will now work with the new administration to get the park designed and built, creating a signature public asset that enhances quality of life in Trenton and the region.



Events & Engagement: Expanding Our Reach

A NEW TRADITION: NEW JERSEY FUTURE DAY AT THE STATE HOUSE

In 2025, we proudly launched the inaugural **New Jersey Future Day at the State House**. This first-of-its-kind event brought our research, policy priorities, and strategic recommendations directly to legislators and policymakers—strengthening relationships and deepening understanding of the issues shaping our state's future.



SHARING KNOWLEDGE WITH IMPACTFUL WEBINARS

The NJF **Funding Navigator** program hosted three educational webinars on debt, shared services, collaboration, climate resilience, and State Revolving Funds (SRF) financing, reaching over 120 participants with Syracuse University Environmental Finance Center and other partners, expanding the reach of our specialized knowledge.

The NJF **Mainstreaming Green Infrastructure** program released an enhanced model municipal stormwater management plan with the Watershed Institute to provide municipalities with updated guidance suited for today's climate threats. NJF hosted a webinar with partners to show over 150 registrants how the new resource can help communities maintain compliance, incorporate green infrastructure projects, and prepare for climate change impacts.

STATEWIDE PRESENCE

New Jersey Future and partners hosted **Walk, Bike, Ride NJ**, a gubernatorial forum where all candidates were invited to discuss their plans for safe active transportation infrastructure and reliable public transit access for people of all ages and abilities in New Jersey.

And for the first time in many years, New Jersey Future tabled at the **New Jersey League of Municipalities Conference**, further expanding our reach with local leaders statewide.



CONFERENCES AND CELEBRATIONS

We continued two major annual traditions thanks to our community participants and generous sponsors.

- **NJ Planning & Redevelopment Conference** — partnering with the New Jersey Chapter of the American Planning Association, convening hundreds of leaders across sectors to exchange ideas, share solutions, and elevate emerging challenges.
- **Smart Growth Awards** — honoring exemplary projects from Madison, West Orange, Hoboken, Princeton, Trenton, and Camden that embody thoughtful planning, community vision, and innovation.

After a year of continuous work and collaboration, in December, **Jersey Water Works** convened its most ambitious and impactful annual conference to date under the theme “Our Commitment to Future Generations,” bringing together a growing and diverse community of water professionals, policymakers, advocates, and partners dedicated to strengthening New Jersey’s water infrastructure for the long term. This year’s conference marked a new high point, featuring the largest number of sessions and speakers, expanded corporate and philanthropic sponsorship, and increased attendance over the previous year—a clear reflection of the urgency and momentum surrounding water infrastructure issues statewide.

The robust agenda fostered meaningful dialogue on critical issues including affordability, governance, stormwater management, PFAS challenges, and emerging contaminants, while reinforcing the value of cross-sector collaboration. This progress would not be possible without the steadfast support of Jersey Water Works’ longstanding supporters and funders. Their continued investment enables the network to grow, innovate, and deliver impact at scale, and for that we are grateful.

Being featured in *Rolling Stone* is usually reserved for chart-toppers, but this time, the spotlight was on climate truth and our very own Executive Director, **Pete Kasabach**. Pete delivered a no-nonsense take on coastal flooding, warning that without serious investment and equitable planning, only the wealthiest residents may be able to ride out the future of life at the Shore.

Together, these highlights, along with staff presentations to thousands of people across the state and nationally, helped bring New Jersey Future's expertise to broader audiences than ever before.



Everything Old is New Again

This year ushered in a wave of renewal for New Jersey Future as we reimagined how we present our work and engage with the people who power it. In December, we debuted our reengineered website—sleek, accessible, and designed for deeper connection. We also introduced our updated mission statement, offering a sharper, more inspiring articulation of our purpose. To advance our advocacy work, we rolled out UJoin, a strategic platform that strengthens our ability to mobilize action and highlight key policy priorities.

As municipalities seek more guidance in today's rapidly changing landscape, we expanded our municipal advisory services to deliver even more targeted, on-the-ground expertise. Together, these innovations represent a renewed promise to meet our diverse audiences with clarity, authenticity, and excitement for what comes next.

STATE PLAN ADOPTION

The adoption of New Jersey's updated State Development and Redevelopment Plan marks a pivotal moment for the state's future—and the first comprehensive update to the Plan since 2001. For New Jersey Future, which has called for a clear, actionable State Plan since our founding in 1987, this milestone reflects years

of sustained advocacy and progress toward a more sustainable and resilient New Jersey. We commend the State Planning Commission and the Office of Planning Advocacy for advancing this important work.

Looking ahead, the Plan creates a real opportunity for the new administration to lead with purpose. With thoughtful implementation, it can help align state policies and investments, guide smarter land-use decisions, and support communities across New Jersey—now and into the future. More than a planning document, the State Plan serves as a practical guide for a state that is prepared, connected, and positioned to thrive.



Facing Challenges with Transparency and Resolve

While 2025 brought meaningful advancements, it was also a year marked by complexity. Like many nonprofits across the country, we experienced the effects of a nationwide funding squeeze—a convergence of funder fatigue, shifting priorities, and increased need for critical philanthropic resources.

This environment required us to think more strategically, operate more efficiently, and lean more heavily on partnership and creativity.

We also navigated political shifts at the local and state levels, each bringing evolving priorities that required agility, patience, and persistence. These realities didn't deter our work—they sharpened it.



Amid state fiscal constraints and the winding down of the Murphy administration, we convened a panel of state agency commissioners to discuss the federal impacts on New Jersey, what their agencies are doing about them, and what they will mean for the next Governor.

A major roadblock we began tackling is that it's still too hard to redevelop in New Jersey. That's why we brought a group of leaders together for a dinner and frank discussion about steps that need to be taken to foster solutions during a new state administration.

Through it all, our team reaffirmed why advocacy, research, and coalition-building remain essential, especially when conditions are challenging.



Looking Ahead: a Bold Vision for 2026

COMMITMENTS INCLUDE:

Grounded in the foundation built this year, New Jersey Future is entering 2026 with clarity and ambition. Key goals for the year ahead include:

1

Advancing the “Planning for Prosperity” Policy Roadmap—Turning recommendations into action by working closely with legislators, state agencies, municipalities, and community partners.

2

Expanding the Great Homes Neighborhoods for All Initiative—Deepening research, building local campaign capacity, and improving the public's understanding around housing affordability and land use reforms.

3

Strengthening Local Engagement and Coalition Partnerships—Expanding relationships with municipalities, funders, advocacy coalitions, and community organizations to advance equitable, community-centered growth.

4

Advancing Clean, Affordable Water Infrastructure—Championing investments that deliver sewage-free streets and rivers while protecting water affordability, ensuring every community has access to safe, reliable, and affordable water services.

2026 will require resilience, creativity, and determination—but we are ready.

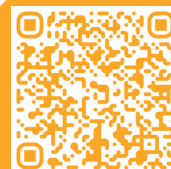
